ABOUT PUERTO RICO A BILINGUAL EXPERIENCE

- Spanish is our native language, but both Spanish and English are official languages in Puerto Rico. While Spanish is the predominant spoken language, most faculty members are fluent in both.
- Puerto Rico is the ideal destination for Spanish speakers wishing to study in a U.S. accredited institution while learning English without postponing a degree.
- Our universities prepare their students with English as a second language so they can thrive in English-speaking professional environments courses and degrees in English.
- The TOEFL is not required to study in Puerto Rico's institutions.

A ROBUST EDUCATION SYSTEM

- Puerto Rico has 54 institutions, organized in 141 campuses all around the island; 5,339 programs including: 105 doctoral, 770 masters, 1,242 bachelor's and 746 associate and 146 professional certificates.
- At least 20% of Hispanics who have completed a doctorate degree in Science or Engineering in the U.S. have pursued their bachelor's degree in P.R.

AFFORDABLE EDUCATION GROUNDED ON HIGH ACADEMIC STANDARDS

- The average cost of academic credits in Puerto Rico is about ¼ of the cost in the U.S. while abiding and complying with the same academic standards.
- Academic credits in Puerto Rico range between \$30 and \$300 depending on the institution and the degree.

HIGH ACADEMIC STANDARDS IN HIGHER EDUCATION

- Our universities abide by the same academic standards than those in the U.S.
- The 54 higher education institutions in Puerto Rico are locally licensed and U.S. accredited by the Middle States Commission in Higher Education; in addition to being awarded internationally recognized accreditations by institutions such as the Association of Advance Collegiate Schools of Business (AACSB), among others.
